












#### SCIENCE

They were able to handle and examine real artifacts from the Holocaust and take part in a role play exercise exploring what children experienced during this time.




# LIFE SKILLS

#### KS4 CAREERS EVENT



Y11 students had their first round of 1to1 interviews with a careers advisor where they explored their skills and qualities to find their most suitable career paths. They have also spent a day exploring the various training opportunities available to school leavers, such as T Levels and apprenticeships.

They also attended the WPT Careers Fair at the Cranworth site where they had a chance to question staff from local colleges and employers that offer training and employment opportunities in areas such as banking, engineering, construction, and the armed forces.

Our equine therepy sessions have resumed this half term and the students have enjoyed being back in the saddle with the horses they have worked so hard to build relationships with. The horses were very excited to see them again too!

Students across both Arran Hill sites have the opportunity to explore the unique therapy horses can bring from developing trust to reducing anxieties. They will also have the amazing opportunity, over the coming months, to complete a series of units linked to horse care, and gain a Stable Management Achieve Award and a Ride Achieve Award through the British Horse Society.
