ODD SOCKS DAY

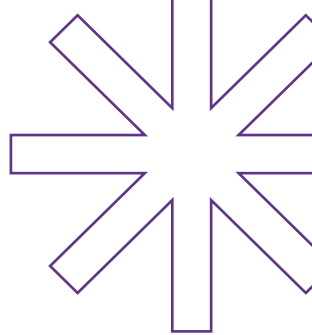

Top gallery's pawtraits will honour heroic service dogs

Dogs are not just for Christmas, they can be lifesavers all year round – as a leading venue's latest exhibition demonstrates.

These portraits by Royal photographer Rankin of canines which provide a helpline to humans are to go on display at Dogs With Jobs, at London's Saatchi Gallery next Sunday.

The photos of the heroic service dogs will raise funds for charity The Kennel Club Charitable Trust.

Some 7,000 people in the UK rely on a support dog, including those giving police statements after a trauma, or even patients on their deathbed.

The trust – in partnership with Dogs For Good, Support Dogs, Medical Detection Dogs and other small funds – has sponsored more than 30 dogs to help adults and children cope with problems.

Dog-lover Rankin was asked to photograph the King for his 75th.

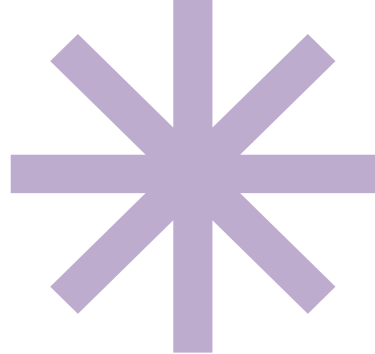

The children also made chocolate lollipops and sold them at the School Christmas Fayre raising £19.00.

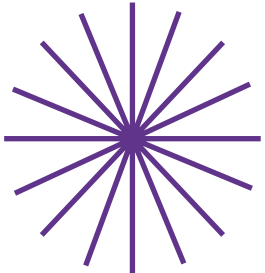
